A heroic landscape (also known as an ideal landscape) is one of beauty and bounty. It does not reflect the unpredictable or ugly parts of life, but rather illustrates the universal truths found in the natural balance and harmony in nature. Academic painters felt that these heroic or ideal landscapes were the only settings suitable for the figures of Christianity and the heroes of Classical mythology.

Claude Lorrain's Aeneas at Delos is a heroic landscape painting.

Mannerists used bizzare angles, odd proportions, imbalanced composition, and elongated figures to show elegance and grace.
